


Chattanooga in the Fall

October 18 - 25, 2017
(8 days - 7 nights)



Wed, Oct 18

Texarkana, AR

With fall in the air our group of travelers will be eager to board the motorcoach and get acquainted with fellow travelers as we route thru the Metroplex and continue to Texarkana to overnight.

Thu, Oct 19

Corinth, MS

Continuing across Arkansas to the east we stop for lunch in Forrest City before crossing the Mississippi River at Memphis into the Volunteer State of Tennessee. Moving slightly to the south, we enter the state of Mississippi, paralleling the Tennessee border to Corinth. Our first stop is the Civil War Interpretive Center which traces the story of Corinth in the Civil War from secession through Reconstruction. It includes state-of-the-art films plus exhibits and stunning bronze work. It also contains a unique water feature that spans 100 years of American history.

Fri, Oct 20

Chattanooga, TN

Soon we enter Alabama and stop in Tusculumbia at the birthplace and home of Helen Keller, the "Miracle Worker". Built in 1820 by the grandparents of Helen Keller, the home survived the ravages of the Civil War. This afternoon we visit the Unclaimed Baggage Center in Scottsboro. The concept of selling items from lost and unclaimed airline luggage has gained national attention in recent years. Leaving Scottsboro, we are just a short drive to Chattanooga, which lies at the transition between the ridge and valley portion of the Appalachian Mountains and the Cumberland Plateau. Sat, Oct 21

Chattanooga, TN

Chattanooga began in 1815 as a small trading post and also served as one of the staging areas of the Cherokee relocation known as the Trail of Tears, but today Chattanooga is the 4th largest city in Tennessee. We begin our day with a city tour to include a ride on the Lookout Mountain Incline Railway, one of the steepest in the world. Later we will tour the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park, the sites of two major battles of the American Civil War and located in northern Georgia and eastern Tennessee. Have your camera ready as we board the Southern Belle Riverboat for a sightseeing cruise on the scenic Tennessee River.

Chattanooga, TN

Enjoy a visit to the Tennessee Aquarium, which highlights the voyage of a drop of water from its origin in the Appalachian Mountains to the Gulf of Mexico. This afternoon we conclude our tour of Chattanooga and enjoy some leisure time.

Mon, Oct 23

Memphis, TN

This morning we depart after our fantastic 3-night stay in the scenic city of Chattanooga and route to Hurricane Mills, the home of country music star, Loretta Lynn. Tour the 18,000 square-ft. Coal Miner's Daughter Museum which contains her memorabilia and costumes. Enjoy a tour of her plantation home, a simulated coal mine, grist mill and a replica Butcher Holler house before we continue to Memphis.

Tue, Oct 24

Texarkana, TX

Begin the day with a tour of Graceland, a mansion on a 13.8 acre estate that was home to Elvis Presley. Our tour will also consist of touring his jets and car museum. We route across Arkansas and to Texarkana to overnight.

Wed, Oct 25

Return home

Our fall tour to include Arkansas, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Tennessee is coming to a close but we will take with us great memories of the trip and the new friends we have met. Today we continue westward, stopping for lunch in the Metroplex before returning home.
